OUR PARISH NURSE: LINDA EVANS LOWE

Linda Evans Lowe has been a member of FUMC since 1985, but she says she can't remember how long she has been serving as our parish nurse. However, during her tenure she has organized two health fairs, numerous blood drives, offered blood pressure checks, bandaged many boo-boos during DayShore Camp, and as a nurse volunteer at Lakeshore Camp, too, as well as served as a guest speaker on heart health and nutrition for several UMW programs. She also maintains our AED (automated external defibrillator) devices.

Linda began her career as an LPN (licensed practical nurse) after graduating from Sea Isle Vocational Technical School in Memphis. As a U.S. Navy wife (married to her husband Mike, who passed away in 2020), she continued her education in California and at St. Joseph Hospital School of Nursing in Memphis to become a registered nurse. She spent the majority

of her career as an OB-GYN nurse working in childbirth and the NICU (neonatal intensive care unit). She stresses, "That's my first love in nursing – the babies!" Linda spent 20 years working at Methodist North Hospital in Memphis, which she says she loved, ending her career in administration as a housing supervisor, keeping track of available rooms and beds, ensuring patients were placed properly.

As cold and flu season are in full swing in our community, Linda offers some simple tips and advice to stay healthy at this time of year: 1) hand washing is the biggest deterrent to spreading germs – take your time and wash your hands well and often, 2) turning your head and covering your face when coughing also helps in not spreading germs to others, 3) taking a multivitamin and proper nutrition – your diet makes all the difference in the world when trying to stay healthy.

In addition to volunteering as our parish nurse, Linda also sings in our Chancel Choir

(as did her husband Mike), volunteers in our food pantry, and is a member of the UMW Anna Circle. Although she is a self-described "Navy brat," living in several places growing up, Linda calls New Orleans her hometown, where she lived until she was 10 years old. She enjoys going back home for Mardi Gras, which she describes as "not so much of a ruckus if you grew up there, but just fun."

She is the mother of four children. She has 13 grandchildren and one great-grandchild. In June 2023, she and her husband Jack were married in our sanctuary. Jack grew up in Memphis, spent eight years in the U.S. Air Force as a pilot, and retired as a pilot for Federal Express. Raised in the Baptist church, Jack does come and worship with us on Sundays from time to time, especially when Linda is singing in the choir. Jack has two children. He and

Creation Care Corner

'TIS A GIFT TO BE SIMPLE...

'TIS A GIFT TO BE FREE



Try these simple tips to be a good steward of God's creation:

- Heating our water consumes much energy. Consider these simple changes to reduce the cost to Earth (and yourself): **Turn your water heater down to 120 degrees**, purchase a new Energy Star water heater, install the tank in an enclosed space, or add a water heater blanket.

- Skip the aluminum foil, plastic wrap, and baggies, and **put food into reusable containers** – preferably glass. Simply reuse what you have. When you cannot avoid packaging, choose metal or glass over plastic – and anything recyclable or compostable over items destined for the trash bin.

- Conserving water can be simple: Take short showers of five minutes or less. **Turn the water down in the shower** so it's not full blast. Scrape plates instead of rinsing them before they go in the dishwasher. Don't leave the water running while washing, shaving, or brushing your teeth. Turn it on and use only as needed.

- Get in the habit of not throwing things away or replacing them unless necessary, and fix them when broken. **Check for leaks** in your toilet and repair if necessary. Leaks are usually caused by worn out flapper valves and can be easily and inexpensively replaced. Replace any worn out washers in faucets to stop drips and leaks.


